
have followed. This award-winning author's latest book is Elena's Story, about a Guatemalan girl.

## Claire's Day, Inc. and Read for Literacy Partnership!

On December 12, 2013 a news conference was held sharing this great news. The following is from the news release created by both organizations.

For many years, Claire's Day volunteers and Read for Literacy volunteers have been engaged in work in our community with children and adults in literacy programming. While both programs have been outstanding, we know there is more to do to create a community where adults and children have the opportunity to achieve their personal and academic goals by strengthening their literacy skills.

Over the course of the last several months, the two organizations engaged in conversations to learn how we could maintain our independence, yet meet the demands of programming going forward.

We are pleased to announce that beginning January 1, 2014 and with mutual respect and admiration for each other's programs, we have decided to form a new collaboration where we will share resources and staff. More details will be discussed at the media conference.

Claire's Day, Inc. is a nonprofit organization honoring Claire Lynsey Rubini, who passed away from a heart condition in 2000 when she was just ten years old. Dedicated to inspiring children and families to be lifelong readers, Claire's Day has become northwest Ohio's largest free family book festival. Each year, an estimated 5,000 people enjoy interactive presentations and book signings by Midwestern children's book authors and illustrators, Claire's Awards for Reading Excellence, hands-on activities based on books by the featured authors and illustrators, Teen Tent for youth self-expression and entertainment by local musicians.

Read for Literacy, Inc. is a nonprofit organization serving Lucas, Wood and Seneca counties to provide a wide range of literacy services through the use of trained volunteer tutors and "reader friends." During 2013, over 1650 adults, children and families participated in Read for Literacy programs, enabling children to engage in emergent literacy skill-building, adults to gain skills that allow them to better provide for their children, continue their education and secure a job in today's information dependent world, and some families to learn the English language for the first time after relocating here for work and school.
